# 5. Centennial Operations Reports

# 5.1 Myuna Colliery:

Myuna Colliery provided an overview of current and proposed operations (see attached presentation).



### Key points:

- Rehabilitation Reform update will form part of Mod 3 to Myuna's consent
- Point Wolstoncroft visit / survey. Myuna to renew the Access Agreement with NPWS.
- Myuna has commenced investigating feasibility on partial extraction in an area in the southern part of the mine lease. The consent permits partial extraction in certain areas and if certain conditions are met (design, management plans etc.). To pursue partial extraction an Extraction Plan is required and submitted to the Department of Planning and Environment for approval. On-shore subsidence remains within the 20mm criteria. The feasibility is in its early stages and if the proposal is to progress, Myuna will advise the Committee.

### 5.2 Mandalong Mine:

Mandalong Mine provided an overview of current and proposed operations (see attached presentation).

Key points:

- Planning to commence mining LW 34. Progression will be to LW 57 (mid 2023) Currently advancing main headings for the eastern domain.
- PS32 (45-3-3514) Mine Plan Change to protect the cave.
- Remediation of rock bench to be scheduled after a period of dry weather.

#### 5.3 Newstan Colliery:

Newstan Colliery provided an overview of current and proposed operations (see attached presentation).

Key points:

- Proposal to inspect the area for the ash dam extension early 2023. Date to be advised.
- Discission on the ongoing management of the area referred to as Awaba Seep and the sink hole remediation.
